COMMUNITY HEALTH RECOVERY AND RESILIENCE PROGRAM

Through a culturally-specific program for hard-to-reach populations, we distributed \$92,304 to assist families affected by COVID illness. Because a healthy community is a strong community.

FAMILY PRESERVATION PROJECT


After three years of pandemic closure, we returned to Coffee Creek Correctional Facility for in-person services. Every month, we helped an average of 101 incarcerated mothers stay connected to their families.

Because keeping families together improves generational, educational, and occupational outcomes.

SOCIAL JUSTICE PROGRAM

We are the largest provider of social justice education in Oregon and certify new Domestic Violence Advocates through a 40-hour training program. We certified 69 DV advocates. Because we still have work to do before justice just is.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

By offering financial management and capacity building support, we fiscally sponsored 30 primarily BIPOC-led and BIPOC-serving community projects to help them thrive. Because community knows what community needs.

SENIOR SERVICES

We support seniors so they can maintain healthy and independent lives in the safety and comfort of their own homes. We helped 740 seniors age in place. Because we all deserve dignity as we age.

SURVIVOR SERVICES

We provide Survivors with housing, therapy, and other wraparound services. We provided 236 households, (primarily BIPOC) with help to rebuild their lives following a traumatic event. Because domestic and sexual violence is a plague on our community.




